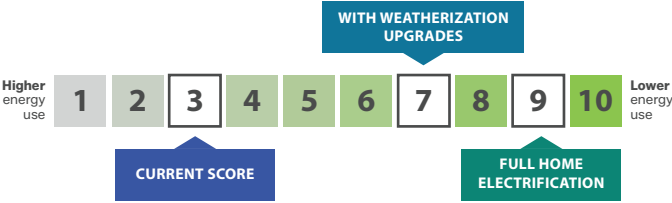


Home Energy Score

The Home Energy Score shows how efficiently your home uses energy, and where you can improve comfort and lower energy bills.



Using a simple **1–10 scale**, the score compares your home’s expected energy use to other homes and highlights opportunities to improve efficiency.



You’ll also receive personalized recommendations—starting with weatherization and building toward electrification—to help make your home more comfortable, more affordable to operate, and climate-friendly. In some areas, energy upgrade rebates may be available. You may also be eligible for \$250 to apply towards the cost of obtaining your score.



Home Energy Score® is a program of the U.S. Department of Energy. The Statewide Home Energy Score California Program is administered by the Bay Area Regional Energy Network (BayREN) and implemented by Earth Advantage. It is funded by Pacific Gas and Electric Company, SDG&E, SoCalGas, and Southern California Edison Company, and utility ratepayers under the auspices of the California Public Utilities Commission.

Four Simple Steps to a Home Energy Score



1. Find an assessor at [HomeScoreCA.org](https://www.HomeScoreCA.org)
2. Schedule a home walk-through
3. Review your score report
4. Start saving energy and improving comfort

A **certified Home Energy Score Assessor** will gather information about your home’s structure, systems, and energy features during a short visit—then generate your score and recommended upgrade pathway.

Home Energy Score Details

A Home Energy Score Assessor collects information during a home walk-through and scores your home on a **1–10 scale**.



A **score of 1** means that your home uses more energy than most and would likely benefit from energy upgrades. A **score of 10** means your home is estimated to use less energy than 90% of homes.

Your Score helps you understand:

- How much energy your home uses today
- How upgrades like insulation, air sealing, or new heating/cooling systems can improve performance
- How weatherization and electrification can reduce drafts, bills, and carbon emissions

What You Receive

Your Score provides:

- **Clear facts** about how your home uses energy and what that might be costing you, based on an in-home assessment
- **Funding resources** such as programs and rebates that are available in your area to make home energy upgrades more affordable.
- **Recommendations** for energy-saving improvements that can increase comfort and efficiency, such as:



Adding insulation
and sealing air leaks



Upgrading to efficient
heat-pump systems



Upgrading to efficient
electric appliances



Sealing leaky
air ducts



Recommended improvements reduce energy waste, improve indoor air quality, and reduce your home’s energy-related carbon emissions.
